Artistic Director

Nathan Kufchak, cellist, attended Ohio Wesleyan University as a cello performance major and studied with members of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, Cavani String Quartet, Emerson String Quartet, and numerous other professional chamber music ensembles. He has worked with faculty from the Cleveland Institute of Music, Ohio University Music Department, Otterbein College Music Department, Capital University Music Department, and the Baldwin Wallace Conservatory of Music.

Mr. Kufchak has performed with the Cavani string quartet, alongside members of the Columbus Symphony, and appeared as a soloist and symphony musician throughout the central-Ohio area.

In addition to performing, Mr. Kufchak is a frequent guest for chamber music clinics and public school classrooms. He has judged local music competitions as well. In addition to serving on the faculty of the Chamber Music Connection in Columbus, Ohio, Mr. Kufchak has served on the faculties of Capital University's Summer Suzuki Institute and the ASTA/NSOA Summer String Institute in Ithaca, NY. As an extension program with the Dublin (Ohio) schools, he taught private cello and bass lessons for several years. He presently maintains a private teaching studio for cello and bass students in the South-Atlanta area.

Heidemarie Traylor, violinist, received her music education degree from Ohio Wesleyan University studying string pedagogy with Deborah Price, Artistic Director of the Chamber Music Connection, Inc., Worthington, Ohio. Ms. Traylor has studied with members of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, Carpe Diem String Quartet, and the Duvall Ensemble. Additionally, she studied at the International Interlochen Arts Camp in Interlochen, MI.

She currently directs middle school orchestra in Clayton County and maintains a private studio for violin, viola, and piano students in the South Atlanta area.

The Chamber Music Connection

The purpose of The Chamber Music Connection is to provide chamber music education for music students of all ages (including adults) and abilities, from the earliest levels of proficiency to the most advanced.

Open to all string, wind, and piano students, participants are afforded the opportunity to hear, see, and work with world-class chamber music ensembles in concerts, master classes, and workshops. Programs are primarily geared to the study of string chamber music repertoire, but they also include collaboration of strings with winds and piano.

Based on their prior experience in chamber music and their age and skill level, participants are generally placed in groups of three, four, or five, allowing for an intimate learning experience. One player on a part encourages individual growth in both musical abilities and reading skills.

General Program Highlights

- Friday after-school ensemble coaching sessions for students of all ages and abilities.
- Students will be assigned to one of two ensemble coaching sessions: **Session I** 4:45 – 5:45PM **OR** **Session II** 7:45 – 8:45PM.
- Students will study with professional faculty coaching teams as well as with guest artists in a masterclass setting.
- All students will be enrolled in a class, “The Language of Music”, from 6:00-6:45 PM. This class will cover information relevant to music being studied, such as history, music theory and analysis.
- All students will also be placed in a chamber orchestra rehearsing from 6:45 – 7:30PM.
- Student performance opportunities include an end-of-semester concert free to the public. Additional opportunities may be available, but are not required.
- Each semester will end with a finale weekend. In addition to Friday’s regularly scheduled events, students will participate in Saturday morning and afternoon activities including master classes and rehearsals. The day’s events will culminate in a free public concert and reception.

Location

Chamber Music Connection-Atlanta meets at the Fayetteville First United Methodist Church located on 175 East Lanier Ave, Fayetteville GA 30214.

Program Dates and Times

Classes are held each Friday from 4:45-8:45pm. The fall semester is from September 12th to November 14th, excluding Friday October 17th. The Winter semester runs from January 9 to March 20, excluding February 13th.

Finale Concert Schedule

Each semester will conclude with a special fun weekend of rehearsal and masterclass activities which occur on Saturday morning and afternoon, culminating in our public performance.

Fall Finale Concert: Saturday November 15, 2008

Winter Finale Concert: Saturday March 21, 2009

CMC Fellowship Program for Advanced High School Students

Students of high school age may apply for the CMC Fellowship Program. Any interested students may contact the Artistic Director for more information. This work-study program is for advanced students interested in music as a career, and offers reduced tuition in exchange for work-study.

CMC Documentation Option

For an additional \$15, CMC-Atlanta can offer students documentation to officiate their CMC experience. The Georgia Home Education Association supports CMC-Atlanta’s curriculum, and has suggested we might offer a certificate of completion that could serve as documentation of program completion. Enrollment, Tuition, Acceptance into Program

Student Tuition is \$265.00 for the semester. To participate, registration must be postmarked by **September 1, 2008**. There is a \$30 discount when signing up for both semesters. Your registration is incomplete unless accompanied by tuition. Students will not be assigned to an ensemble without receipt of tuition. Enrollment is limited. The Artistic Director will consider students for acceptance into the program in the order their completed registrations are received. Registrations postmarked after deadline dates require approval by the Artistic Director and a **\$25 Late Fee**. Late registrants will be added at the discretion of the Artistic Director as space permits.

There is no audition requirement for acceptance into the program. CMC-Atlanta is an equal opportunity organization. A limited amount of scholarship and financial aid are available. Contact the Administrative Coordinator for more information.
